Fellowship Question: What has been the best fishing trip you have ever been on?

Study Questions for the Sermon and Text:

Week 4: Reflecting on Psalm 34:3-8, John 21:1-14, and the WPC sermon from May 6, 2018.

- 1) What’s the most memorable meal you’ve had? What made it memorable?
- 2) Read Psalm 34
 - a) What part of this psalm resonates with you? Is there anything that is frustrating? Anything that is reassuring?
 - b) In the first verse, the Psalmist writes, “I will bless the Lord at all times...” What does it mean to “bless the Lord”? When is it most difficult for you to bless God?
- 3) Read John 21:1-14
 - a) As Simon Peter and six other disciples decide to go fishing, they’re returning to a familiar role. They were fishermen before they met Jesus, so they went back to what they knew. Why?
 - b) Jesus calls out to the disciples from shore with a simple greeting, essentially saying, “fellas, have you caught anything?” What is something we can learn from the way he approaches them?
 - c) Why don’t you think the disciples recognized Jesus on the shore right away?
 - d) What do you think Jesus was trying to teach them through the miraculous catch? What should we take from their response to His instructions?
 - e) What do you make of Simon Peter’s response (putting on clothes, jumping in the water, and swimming to shore)?
