Fellowship Question: In school, how hard were foreign languages for you?

Study Questions for the Sermon and Text:

Reflecting on Psalm 104:24-34, Acts 2:1-41, and the WPC sermon from May 20, 2018.

- 1) Have you ever experienced or “felt” God’s presence in a tangible or personal way?
How would you describe your experience?
- 2) Pastor Dave mentioned that Pentecost was important for first century Jewish people because it connected the present with the past. Why is it important to remember our past? What is one way your past shapes your faith today?
- 3) Read Acts 2:1-41.
 - a) The crowds around Peter and the disciples are astonished by their ability to speak in multiple languages (aren’t all these men Galileans?). Some even claimed they were drunk. How would you respond if you witnessed the Pentecost event?
 - b) Reflect on Peter’s address to the crowd (verses 14-36). What do we know about the people he addresses? What claims does he make about Jesus?
 - c) Think back to Peter being reinstated as a leader by Jesus (John 21:15-19). How is he assuming the role that Jesus gave him?
 - d) In verses 38-39, Peter gives instructions to new Christ followers. He starts with the word, “repent.” What does repentance mean to you? Does anything else stand out about his instructions?

Reflection: What will you do this week to be better prepared for God’s use?
